A Day in the Life of Patty Barnacle, Vice President Rules

Mark your calendars!

2006 MWGA Spring Meeting will be held at Bearpath Golf & Country Club May 1.

Look for details in your 2006 yearbook.

My preparation for a championship is much like a player's preparation for a State Championship. The player plays a practice round taking notes on yardage, club selections, ball position, speed of the greens and overall course condition. I do very much the same in my course review, but I also consider aspects of the course



that most players don't even notice.

First, I meet with the golf professional staff and Tournament Director to get their input on course setup.

Then I play the course from the tentative yardage and critique the course layout. I look at how the course is defined and marked, noting any unusual situations. I note where forecaddies and rules officials should be located, where shuttles are needed, where drinking water is provided on the course. The Tournament Director and I determine the best locations for tournament headquarters, registration, starting tents, scoring tent and the scoreboard. We discuss how many volunteers are needed, availability of practice rounds and, finally, we discuss budget and food service.

The day before the tournament, a small group of tournament and rules committee members plays the course for a final review to check conditions, noting any ground under repair and making sure all requests we made to the superintendent are completed. Following the round, we have one last meeting to discuss any final details or concerns.

On the first day of the tournament I kiss my husband good-bye generally around 4 a.m. so I can be on-site by 5 a.m. I have a long list of details to take care of before the players even arrive. First I help setup the MWGA tournament headquarters for the volunteers, registration table and starting and scoring tents. We check to make sure the starters and scoring kits have all the necessary supplies in them and are at their locations and hang all signs and banners. Sometime during the tournament I make sure the trophies have been polished and the medals and gift certificates are all ready for the awards ceremony.

While all the setup work is underway, the Tournament and Rules Consultant, Bill Homeyer, is on the course taking care of last-minute details. I assist him as needed with tasks such as marking ground under repair, checking hole locations, tee marker placements and lasering the par 3s.

The rest of my day is spent doing whatever is needed to make the tournament run smoothly for the players and volunteers. I perform a variety of tasks each day such as backing up the Tournament and Rules Consultant regarding rulings and monitoring pace of play. Unlike the other volunteers and staff working the tournament who are assigned a specific job to perform, my job is to fill in wherever there are gaps.

After the last players have turned in their scorecards, I assist the intern with pairings and starting times for the following day. Finally, I end my working day and arrive home in time to kiss my husband good night, catch a few hours of sleep and do it all over again the next day.

State Am Talent Goes Deep

Wayzata Country Club played host to the 34th Minnesota Women's State Amateur August 15-17, when numerous past champions competed alongside dozens of current and former Division I college golfers in the MWGA's premier event of the summer.

Some familiar names topped the leader board all three days of competition. University of Nebraska junior **Chrissie McArdle** had a share of the lead each of the first two days, and polished off her final round three strokes ahead of her closest pursuer, posting 74-75-72 for a 221. Playing in the second to last group in the final round, McArdle came in somewhat under the radar, as all eyes were on the final pairing of home-course favorite **Alissa Super, Sarah Butler and Leigh Klasse**. McArdle had 11 pars, 4 birdies and 3 bogeys for her final round win.

Perennial top-shelf state golfer Klasse also had a piece of the lead after each of the first two rounds, and closed out her solid performance in second place for the second consecutive year, shooting 74-75-75 for a 224. **Lisa Meshke** finished in third place with 225 and Super's 226 put her in fourth place for the tournament. Three others tied for fifth.

of play, with all rounds finishing in under
four hours. The first group out on the
second day, a twosome, played in less than
three hours and both players bettered their
first-day scores.

Minnesota.
